



IoCS Supported Contract Training



Working with partners, the Confederation of Construction Specialists has developed a **Construction Contractual Dispute Avoidance level 4 Programme** for the construction industry which is supported by the Chartered Institute of Construction Specialists.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND THE PROGRAMME?

The programme is designed specifically to provide a broad appeal and is targeted at all construction staff who work with contracts.

The programme is Supported by the Institute of Construction Specialists. Therefore, candidates should be prepared to meet the Institute's criteria to complete the programme.

HOW LONG IS THE PROGRAMME?

The programme covers six modules over seven days and is delivered online.

As each module has an assignment completion element, the course dates for each module will be set approximately six weeks apart. The programme will therefore take approximately eight months to complete.

FAQs...

Are there any exams to pass?

No, there are not any exams to pass. However, six assignments will need to be passed during the duration of the programme.

Will I receive an IOCS certificate, and at what level is the programme set at?

Yes, an IoCS certificate will be issued on completion of the programme. The level of the programme is set at level 4.
